in power quality and reliability in J.D. Power and Associates study

Scores of Utilities in the Mid-Atlantic Region

NOVEC RANKS HIGH IN CUSTOMER SATISFACTION

NOVEC customers have given their Co-op high scores in the J. D. Power and Associates' 2018 Electric Utility Residential Customer Satisfaction StudySM. Among the nation's 138 largest investor-owned utilities, electric cooperatives, and public power systems, NOVEC ranks third highest in overall customer satisfaction.

NOVEC's overall score of 796 is its highest ever. Two cooperatives in Georgia placed ahead of NOVEC by eight and four points. Overall, 15 electric co-ops placed in the top 20. Among the 10 utilities in the Mid-Atlantic area, NOVEC scored the highest, as it has every year since 2009.

The study asked customers about their utility's power quality and reliability, price, billing and payment, corporate citizenship, communications, and customer service. NOVEC ranked first in the nation in power quality and reliability, which accounts for the largest portion of the total score. NOVEC is the only electric brand to score among the top 10 in the other five categories.

"NOVEC is pleased our customers have ranked us as one of the top three electric brands in the U.S. in the J.D. Power study," said Stan Feuerberg, NOVEC president and CEO. "In particular, we're pleased our customer-owners gave us the highest score in the nation for power quality and reliability. NOVEC's investments in our robust system infrastructure and smart-grid technologies, and our constant attention to system maintenance, have kept the power on 99.99 percent of the time and given us high customer satisfaction."
