Tip of the Month:

Heading out of town for the holidays? Remember to unplug electronics like TVs, gaming consoles, chargers and DVD players. These devices use energy when plugged in, even if they're not in use.

DECK THE HALLS SAFELY THIS SEASON

Decorating for the holidays? Make sure to follow lighting safety precautions to prevent overloaded circuits and other electrical hazards. Follow these tips:



Be sure lights are marked with a certification label, such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL), so you know the lights have been safety tested.



Inspect electrical decorations for damage, such as bare or frayed wires, and loose connections. These can cause serious shock or fire.



Check that outdoor decorations are marked for outdoor use.



Use electric or battery-operated candles and flame-resistant tree decorations.



Read instructions to know how many light strands can be safely connected to each other.



Never pinch a cord between doors, windows, or furniture and never place it under a rug.



Don't attach cords to any surface with nails or staples, and keep them away from heat sources.



Never plug multiple extension cords/surge protectors together in a "daisy chain."



Make sure your circuits are protected by ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs) or purchase cords or devices that provide built-in GFCI protection.
