ARE YOU PREPARED FOR SUMMER STORMS?

Severe storms with heavy rain, lightning and high winds can cause flooding and power outages. Know what to do before and during an outage by visiting novec.com/safety, and follow these tips:

- Keep cellphones charged, and have a full-battery portable charger as backup.
- Unplug TVs, microwave ovens, and computers to protect them from power surges and lightning strikes.
- Avoid property loss or damage by securing outdoor items, including bikes, grills, and patio furniture.
 Bring items indoors if possible so they don't get caught in high winds.
- Do not enter a flooded basement if power has not been turned off.
 The water can carry dangerous electrical current.
- Have an emergency kit prepared with water, nonperishable food, a first-aid kit, and extra batteries.

- During an outage, use flashlights or battery-powered lanterns instead of candles to prevent fire hazards.
- If you see downed power lines or poles, stay away — the ground around them can be energized and dangerous. Notify NOVEC immediately. If phone lines are busy, call 911.
- If your power goes out, call 703-335-0500, report it online at novec.com, or text #OUT to 85700 with a NOVEC-listed cellphone number.

SETTING SIGHTS ON SOLAR

NOVEC has reached an agreement to purchase 300 megawatts of electricity from solar-energy "farms" owned by D.E. Shaw Renewable Investments (DESRI). The new solar electricity will add to the 60 megawatts of renewable energy NOVEC already distributes to Co-op customers from its woody biomass generating plant in Halifax County, as well as generators that use hydropower, solar energy, and landfill methane gas.

NOVEC President and CEO Stan Feuerberg said, "This agreement with DESRI is another step toward meeting our customers' expectations for more renewable energy in NOVEC's resource mix. Our strategy is to continue improving our environmental footprint through the addition of new renewable-energy sources that are not only clean, but also affordable. This partnership with DESRI does just that."
