LOOK ON YOUR DECEMBER BILL FOR YOUR CASHBACK

NOVEC members will see a CashBack credit applied to their December bill — that means more money stays in your pocket. The board of directors voted to retire and return to NOVEC members approximately \$4.23 million from the Co-op's revenue margins.

What is CashBack?

Like any electric utility, NOVEC uses its revenue to operate, upgrade, and expand its electric system, and to restore power when outages occur. Because NOVEC is a not-for-profit business, any revenues that are over and above the cost of conducting business are returned to customers. It is through the CashBack program that NOVEC retires, or returns, a portion of customers' allocated margins. Learn more at novec.com/cashback.

JOIN OPERATION ROUND UP®

Help low-income Co-op members stay warm this winter by participating in Operation Round Up.

"It's hard to believe anyone in wealthy Northern Virginia struggles to pay household bills, but many do," says Ashley Arnold, ORU administrator. "By contributing an average of 50 cents every month, you can help an elderly neighbor, a young person, or a single parent who has to choose between food and electricity."

ORU participants allow NOVEC to round up their monthly electric bills to the nearest dollar. For example, if a bill is \$64.73, NOVEC will round it up to \$65. Since NOVEC takes care of all administrative costs, the extra 27 cents goes into the ORU fund. The ORU Advisory Committee distributes money from that fund to social service agencies.

LOWER YOUR WINTER ENERGY BILLS

Use these cold weather energy-saving tips to help you save money this season:

- Replace or clean your air filters to help your system operate more efficiently.
- Open curtains or blinds on sun-facing windows to allow in light and heat.
- Seal air leaks around windows and doors with caulk or weatherstripping.
- * Keep vents unobstructed by furniture or pet beds.
- Block cold air from outlets and switchplates with insulating foam pads and plug inserts.
- Close fireplace flue dampers and glass doors when not in use to keep heated air from escaping up the chimney.
- Use a programmable thermostat to automatically lower the set temperature when you are out of the house, and raise it just before you return home.
