

HIGH SCHOOL SOPHOMORES AND JUNIORS: APPLY NOW FOR YOUTH TOUR 2020

NOVEC is accepting applications for the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) Youth Tour of Washington, D.C., June 21-25, 2020. Applicants must be public, private, or homeschooled high school sophomores or juniors whose homes are currently served by NOVEC.

Youth Tour 2020

After reviewing the applications, NOVEC will email students who have been selected for in-person interviews. The Co-op will choose five students who demonstrate an interest in history, government, and community involvement. These students, along with more than 1,800 students nationwide, will spend five days in the nation's capital and tour museums, historic sites, and memorials; meet congressional representatives; and enjoy special events and entertainment.

How to Apply

Applicants must write an essay about one of the topics listed on the application and must submit two letters of recommendation. A completed application and all required materials must be received by 5 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 7, 2020.

DO YOU HAVE A WINTER WEATHER CAR EMERGENCY KIT?

NOVEC encourages all members to be mindful of winter vehicle emergency preparedness as the weather gets colder and the chances of snow and ice increase. Keep these items in your vehicle to stay prepared during the winter season:

- Ice scraper and snow brush
- Blanket
- Extra socks, gloves or mittens, hats
- Mar
- A bag of sand or cat litter for better tire traction
- Collapsible or folding snow shovel
- Jumper cables
- Flares or reflective triangle
- Cellphone charger or backup battery bank
