

STAY SAFE DURING WINTER STORMS

In the colder months, heavy snow and severe winter weather can bring down trees and tree limbs, knocking out power. Follow these tips during a winter outage:

- If you are under a winter storm warning, stay home.
 Do not drive unless it is in an emergency.
- Watch or listen for emergency information and alerts. Sign up for emergency alerts from your local government.
- Have an emergency kit prepared with flashlights, extra batteries, blankets, winter clothes, medications and nonperishable food.
- Only use a portable generator outdoors in a dry, wellventilated area. Avoid placing the generator in a location where carbon monoxide could enter your home.
