## **Biomass Plant Provides Green Energy Alternative**



ince November 2013, NOVEC's 49-megawatt biomass plant has been producing environmentally-friendly electricity using waste wood from logging operations as the primary fuel source. This waste wood (the part of the tree that has no commercial value) previously was either left in piles to decompose, which produced methane -a harmful greenhouse gas – or burned on the property where the logging activity occurred. Now that waste wood is used to produce green energy.

### **Keep Your Home Energy Efficient** While You're on Summer Vacation

efore going on vacation, whether for a long weekend or several weeks, prepare your home beforehand to keep it secure and energy efficient.

Turn off lamps and lights, but for security set a few to come on at night with timers. Halogen, compact fluorescent



lamp (CFL) or light-emitting diode (LED) bulbs save more energy than incandescent bulbs and they last longer. A light sensor on an outdoor lamp post will turn bulbs on at dusk and shut them off at dawn. Easy-to-install solar-powered garden lights will do the same and they're easy to install. For extra protection, install motiondetector flood lights to startle a burglar.

Reset the Air Conditioner to a temperature just sufficient to control humidity and protect pets and plants. For each degree set higher, you'll save 2-3 percent on the cooling portion of your electric bill. If you turn off your AC, keep in mind that the hotter your house becomes the more energy your refrigerator and freezer will use to keep food cold.

Adjust the refrigerator temperature from 40 degrees to 42. Food will stay cold when no one is opening the door.

Adjust the water heater. Turn a gas water heater dial to "vacation." Turn off an electric water heater by removing the appropriate fuse or by switching off the water heater circuit breaker. (Look inside your home's electric box.) Leave yourself a note to turn the unit back on or up when you return home.

Unplug sensitive appliances and devices -- Powerful summer thunder storms can damage sensitive home appliances and devices. Unplug the microwave oven, computers, printers, televisions, DVD players, and other electronic devices. Make it easy by plugging nearby devices into an electric outlet strip.

Close window treatments to block hot solar rays. If you don't have treatments, cover windows with white sheets and thumbtacks. White shades and blinds, and white-lined curtains reflect the most rays.
